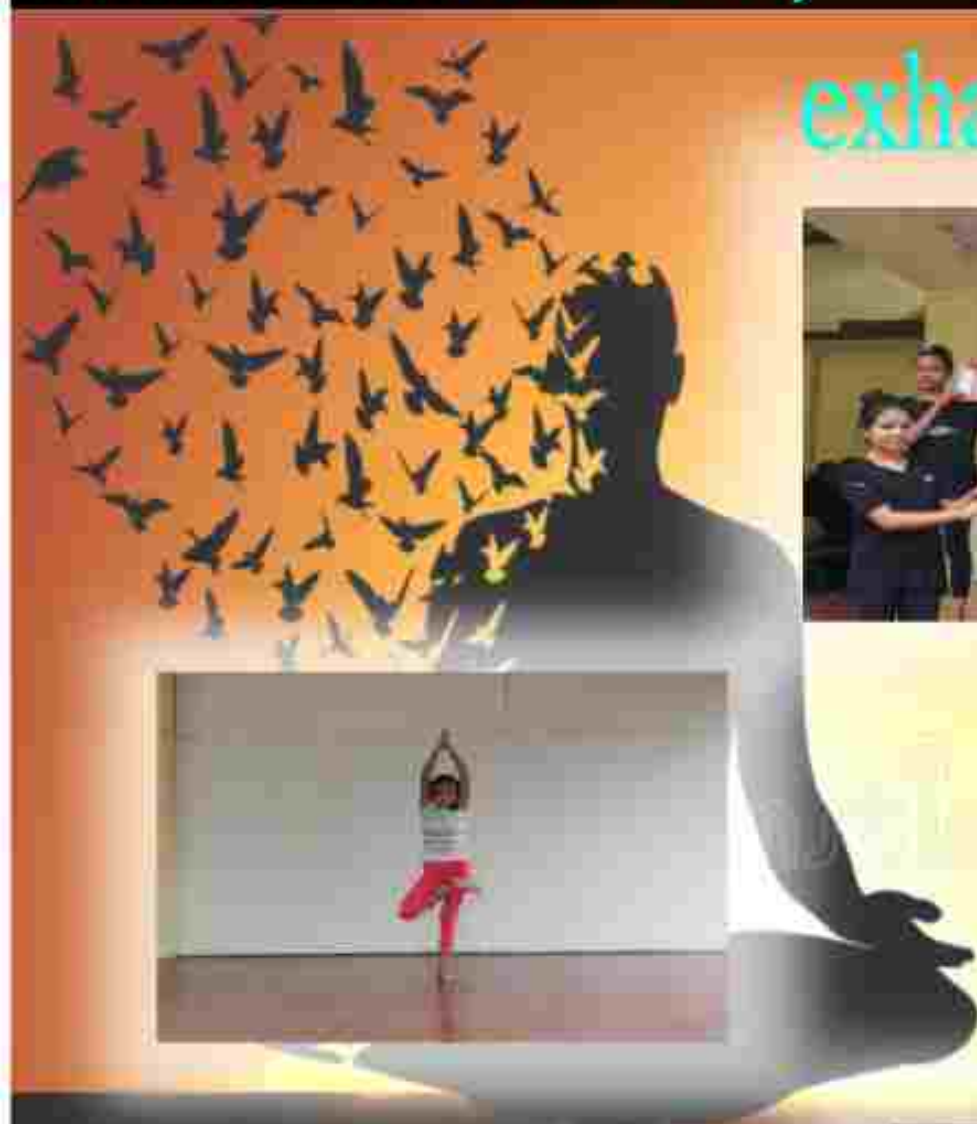

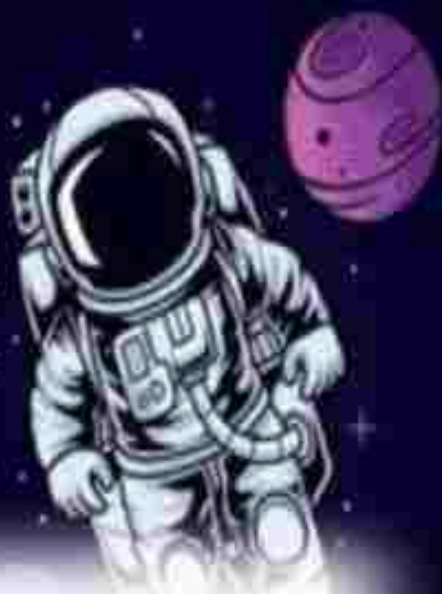

Salim Ali -the Birdman of India

Salim Moizuddin Abdul Ali (12 November 1896 – 20 June 1987) was an Indian ornithologist and naturalist. Sometimes referred to as the "Birdman of India", Salim Ali was the first Indian to conduct systematic bird surveys across India and wrote several bird books that popularized ornithology in India. He became a key figure behind the Bombay Natural History Society after 1947 and used his personal influence to garner government support for the organisation, create the Bharatpur bird sanctuary (Keoladeo National Park) and prevent the destruction of what is now the Silent Valley National Park.

Salim Ali received numerous awards including the J. Paul Getty International Award, the Golden Ark of the International Union for Conservation of Nature, the Golden Medal of the British Ornithology Union (A rarity for the non-British) and a Padma Shree and Padma Vibhushan from the Indian Government, three honorary Doctorates and numerous other awards.

My heart is weary, lost.

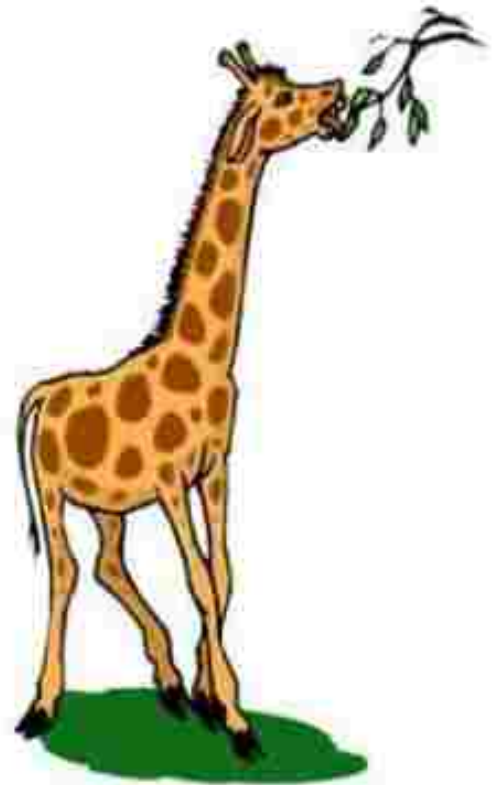
Jilly the Giraffe

The world is home to 1.2 billion individuals aged 10-19 years. However, despite its menace in various forms the data shows variations in prevalence of child labour across globe and the statistical figures about child labour are very alarming. In India, the Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act 1986 and Rules state that no child shall be employed or permitted to work in any of the occupations set forth in Part A of the Schedule or in any workshop wherein any of the processes set forth in Part B of the Schedule is carried on. For this purpose, "child" means a person who has not completed his 14th year of age. The Act prohibits employment of children in certain specified hazardous occupations. Child labour is to be stopped in the world. Let's raise voice for that..
