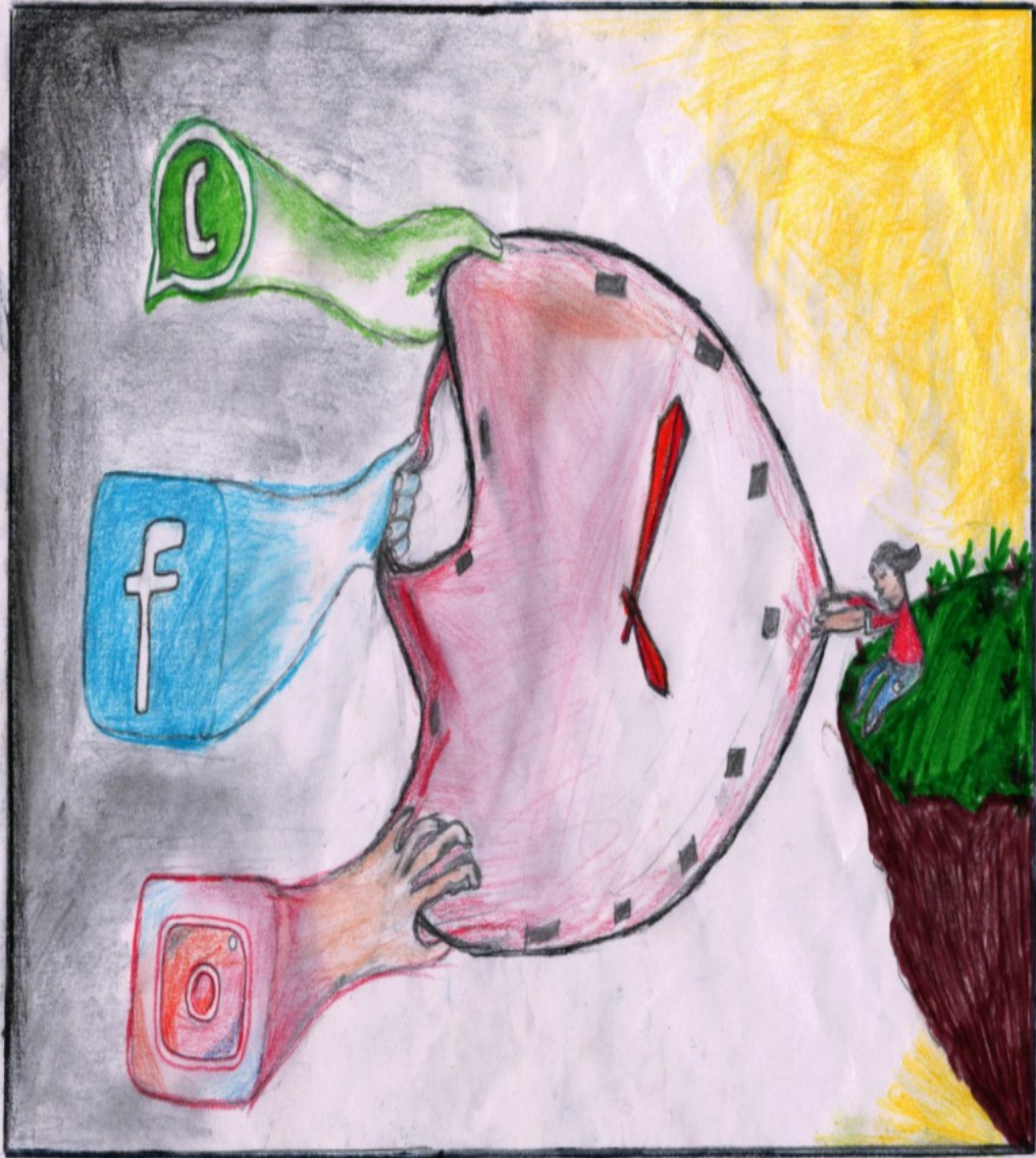
Lakh student members. The High-school Kutti Kootam programme,

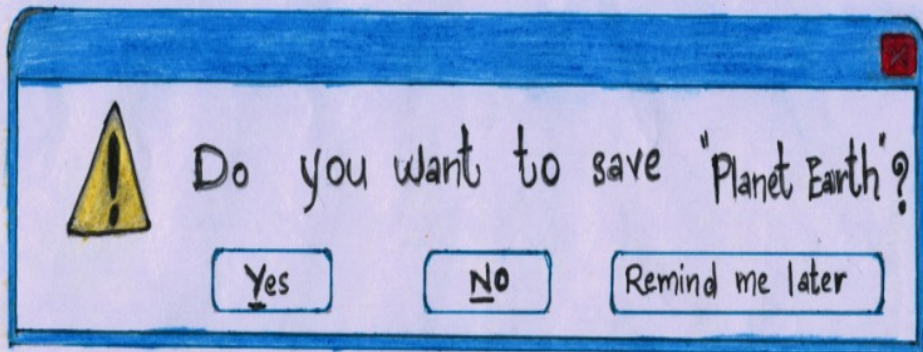

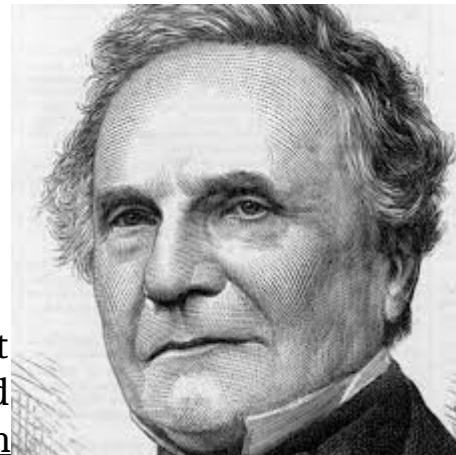

CHARLES BABBAGE

Charles Babbage was born on 26 December 1791 at London. He was an English polymath, a mathematician, philosopher, inventor and mechanical engineer. Babbage originated the concept of a digital programmable computer. He is known as the 'Father of computer'



The modern computer was born out of the urgent necessity after the second world war to face the challenge of Nazism through innovation. But the first iteration of the computer as we now understand it came much earlier when, in the 1830s, Charles Babbage designed a device called the 'Analytical Engine'. That is why he came to be known as the 'Father of computer'.

He passed away on 18 October 1871 in the age of 79.

STEPHEN HAWKING

British theoretical physicist, cosmologist and author;

Stephen Hawking (8 January 1942-14 March 2018) was an English theoretical physicist and mathematician. He was born in Oxford .In 1950,he moved to St Albans, Hertfordshire. He was one of the world's leading theoretical physicist. Hawking has written many science books for people who care not scientist



Hawking was professor of mathematics at the university of Cambridge (a position that Isaac Newton once had).He retired on 1 October 2009

Hawking had a motor neurone disease related to his dyslexia ,and because of that he could not move or talk very well

The illness worsened over the years and he was almost completely paralysed .He used wheelchair to move,and an Intel computer to talk for him .He died on 14 March 2018

Early Life and Education

Hawking went to St Albans School; a local public school in Hertfordshire. At 17, he passed an exam to study at Oxford. He studied physics and chemistry there. Because he found it really easy at the beginning, he didn't study a lot for final exams.

In October 1962 he started his graduate course at Trinity Hall. It was at this time that his illness started to show up. He had difficulties in rowing and then even simply in walking. However, he finished his PhD and wrote about black holes in his thesis. He then got a fellowship (a job as a university teacher) at Gonville and Caius College 1965

Death

Hawking died on 14 March 2018 in Cambridge, Cambridgeshire of complications from motor neuron disease. He is buried in Westminster Abbey in London near Charles Darwin and Isaac Newton

DR B.R AMBEDKAR

Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar also known as Baba Sahib Ambedkar, was an Indian jurist, economist, politician and reformer who inspired the Dalit Buddhist movement and campaigned against social discrimination towards the untouchables (Dalits). He was Independent India's first law and justice minister, the major architect of the Indian constitution.



Ambedkar was a prolific student, earning doctorates in economics from both Columbia University and the London School of Economics, gaining a reputation as a scholar for his research in law, economics, and political science. In his early career, he was an economist, professor, and lawyer. His later life was marked by his political activities; he became involved in campaigning and negotiations for India's independence, publishing journals, advocating political rights and social freedom for Dalits. Ambedkar's legacy includes numerous memorials and depictions in popular culture.

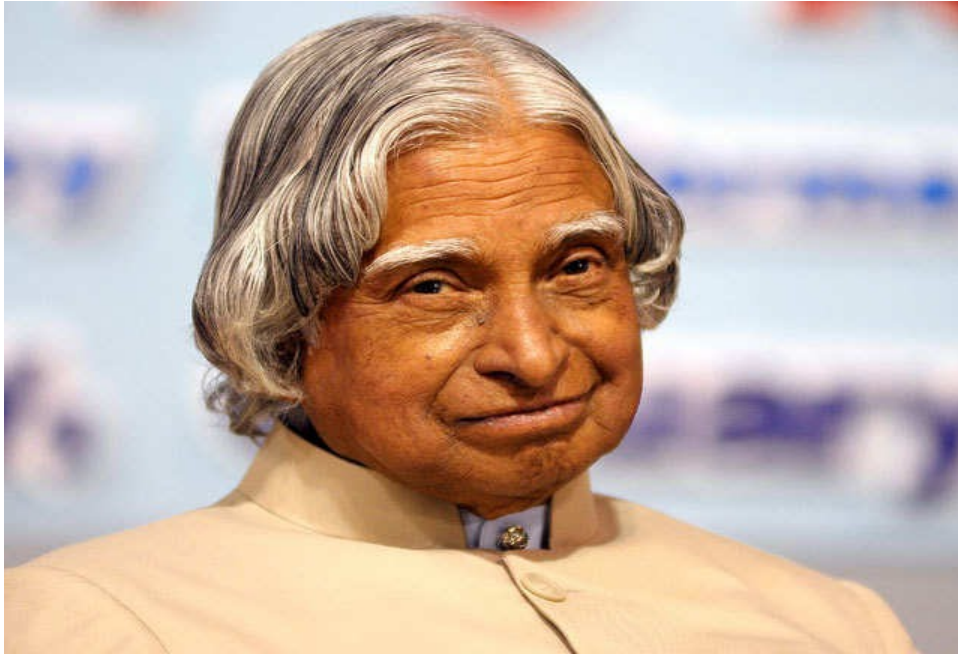

Venkataraman was Defence Minister, Kalam was appointed the chief executive of the Integrated guided ' Missile Man of India' for his work in the development of ballistic missile technology. During 1992 to 1999 Kalam became India's best known scientist. In 2002 Abdul Kalam was elected as the India's 11th president . He was the first scientist to become India's president.

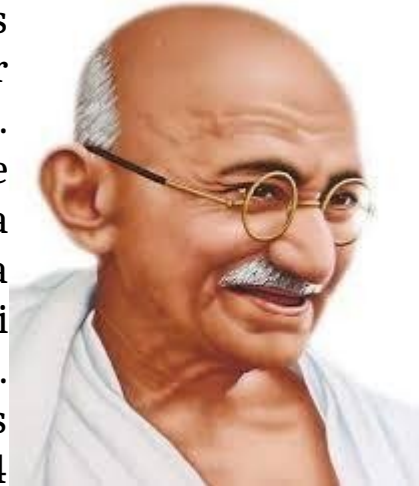

MAHATMA GANDHI

Mahatma Gandhi also known as Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi. He was the Leader of Indian Independence movement. Gandhi was born on 2nd October 1869, to a Hindu Modh Baniya family in Porbandar, in British India. Karamchand Gandhi and his mother's name is Putlibai Gandhi. His father served as the divan of Porbandar state. Mohandas has two elder half-sisters and three elder siblings. Baby Mohandas grew up to be a very shy child. At school, Mohandas was not a brilliant student. He married Kasturba Makhanji Kapadia in an arranged marriage in May 1883. He was 13 years old and Kasturba was 14 years old at the time of their marriage. They had 4 children. At the age of 19, Gandhi went to England to become a lawyer. After returning from South Africa to India in 1891, he began to practice law in Bombay. Then he went to South Africa to work at a law firm. There he witnessed rampant acts of racism and discrimination, which angered him greatly. Once he was asked to move from the first-class in a train in spite of having a valid ticket solely on the basis of his color; and another time he was asked to remove his turban. These incidents angered him and kindled in him the spirit to fight for social justice. He spent over 20 years in the country during the Indian community of South Africa into a unified political force. Gandhi returned to India in 1915. He joined the Indian National Congress and by 1920, his followers gave him the attribute Mahatma, meaning great soul. He called for all the Indians to unite, irrespective of the divisions of religion, caste, and creed in the country, to fight for independence. He advocated non-cooperation with British rule. On 30 January 1948, as Gandhi completed a two-day hunger strike in New Delhi, he was shot dead by a Hindu nationalist called Nathuram Godse at the age of 78. He established a principle called Gandhism, and the two pillars of Gandhism are truth and non-violence.

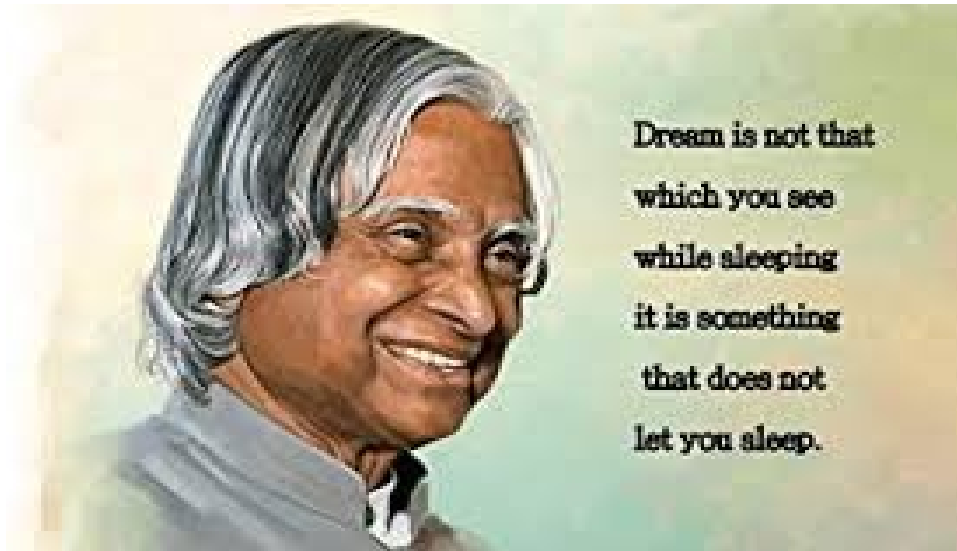

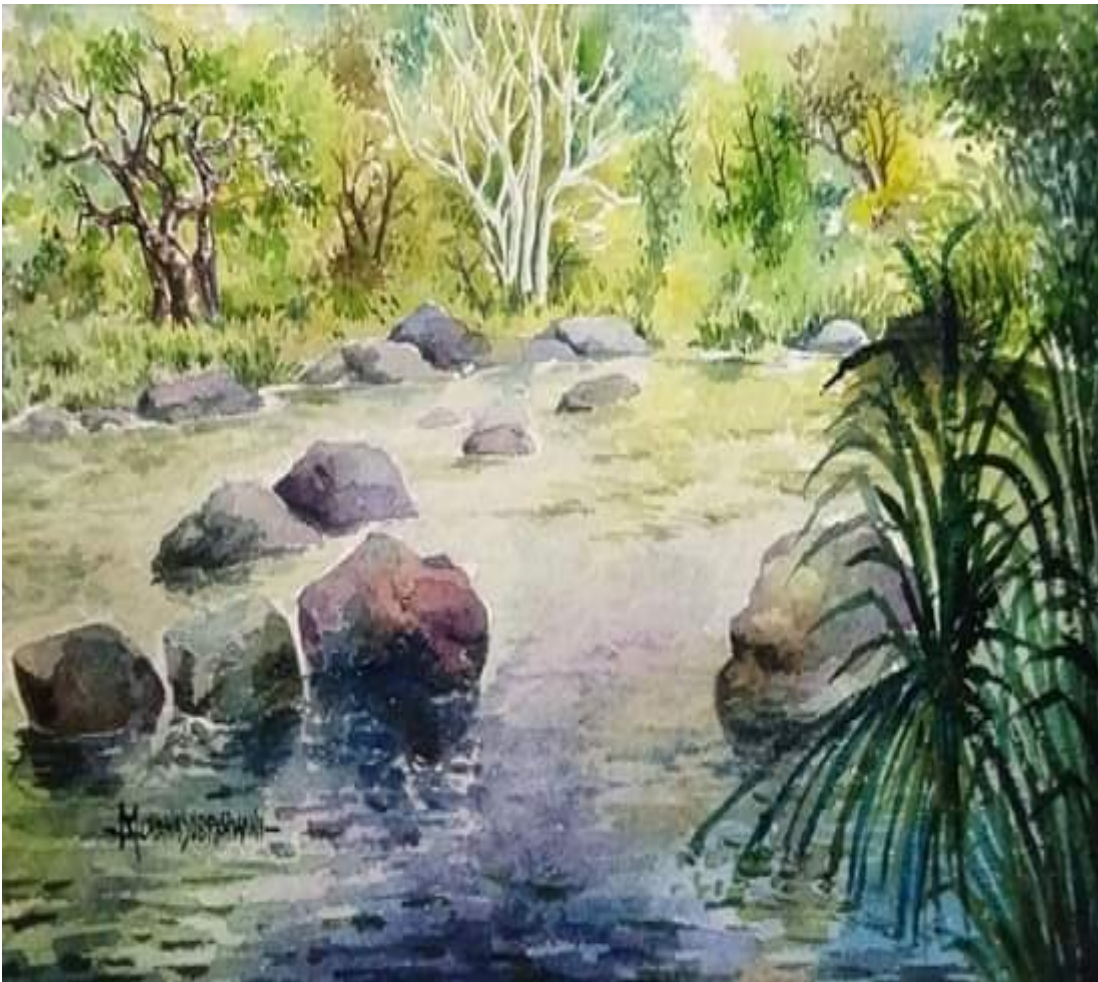

SWAMI VIVEKANANDA

One of the greatest spiritual leaders of India, Swami Vivekananda is credited with bringing the glory of the Hindu philosophy to the global platform. Born on January 12, 1863, as Narendra Nath Datta in Kolkata in to an aristocratic Bengali Kayastha family, he became a disciple of the famed saint of nakshineshwar, Swami Ramakrishna Paramahansa.

He renounced worldly pleasures and became a sanyasi not to roam aimlessly, but for the service of humanity. Swami Vivekananda was a key figure for introducing the Indian Vivekananda and philosophies of yoga to the world which put India on the world's spiritual map.

It was his famous speech at the world's parliament of religions in Chicago, 1893 that forever changed the way the world looked at India.

Founder of Ramakrishna Mission, Vivekananda not only revived our ancient heritage, but also enlightened and awakened people's religious consciousness and worked for uplifting the downtrodden. He is also credited for raising interfaith awareness, reviving Hinduism and contributing to the idea of Nationalism in India in the 19th century. Remembering the great saint Swami Vivekananda on his timeless quotes here which are pertinent even today.

CHARLES BABBAGE

Charles Babbage was born on December 26, 1791, in London England. His father Benjamin j.r was a banker and merchant. One of his grandfathers, Benjamin had been major of todhes , England. Babbage was always curious, which he would ask his mother, Elizabeth. What was inside of it. He would then take apart the toy to figure out how it worked Babbage was also interested in mathematics at a young age, and he thought himself algebra.

The Babbage family was wealthy, and Charles received much of his early education from private tutors. In 1810 he entered trinity college at cam bridge university. He found that he knew more about mathematics than his instructors very unhappy with the poor state of mathematical instructor there, Babbage society, which played a key role in reducing the uncritical following of sir issac Newton(1642-1727; english scientist mathematician and astronomer) at cam bridge and at oxford university. In 1814, the same year of Babbage's graduation from cam bridge, he married Georgiana Whitemore. They had eight children together but only three lived beyond childhood. Georgiana herself died in 1827

MATHEMATICAL ENGINES

In 1822 Babbage produced the first model of the calculated and printed interest of his life. The machine calculated and printed mathematical tables. He called it a "different engines" after the mathematical theory upon which the machine's operation was based. The government was interested in his device and made a vague promise to found his research. This encouraged Babbage to begin building a full-scale machine.

But Babbage had underestimated the difficult involved many of the machine tools he needed to shape the wheels, gears, and cranks of the engine did not exist. Therefore Babbage and his craftsmen had to design the tools themselves. The resulting delays worried the government and the funding was held back.

Meanwhile, the idea for a far grander engine had entered Babbage's ever active mind. The "analytical engine". The machine would be able to perform any mathematical operation according to a series of instruction given to the machine. Babbage asked the government to finish after on eight year pause for thought, the government decided that it wanted neither.

Babbage managed to squeeze in an incredible variety of activities between dealing with the government and working on his engines in addition to other subjects, he wrote several articles on mathematics. The decline of science in England, the rationalization of manufacturing process, religion, archeology , tool design and submarine navigation. He helped to found the astronomical society, which later became the royal astronomical society, as well as other organizations. He was lucasion professor of mathematics at cam bridge for ten years. He was better known though for his seemingly endless campaign against organ grinder(people who produce music by cracking a hand organ)on the streets of London.

He always returned to his great engines but none were finished. He died on October 18,1871, having played a major part in the nineteenth century rebirth of British science

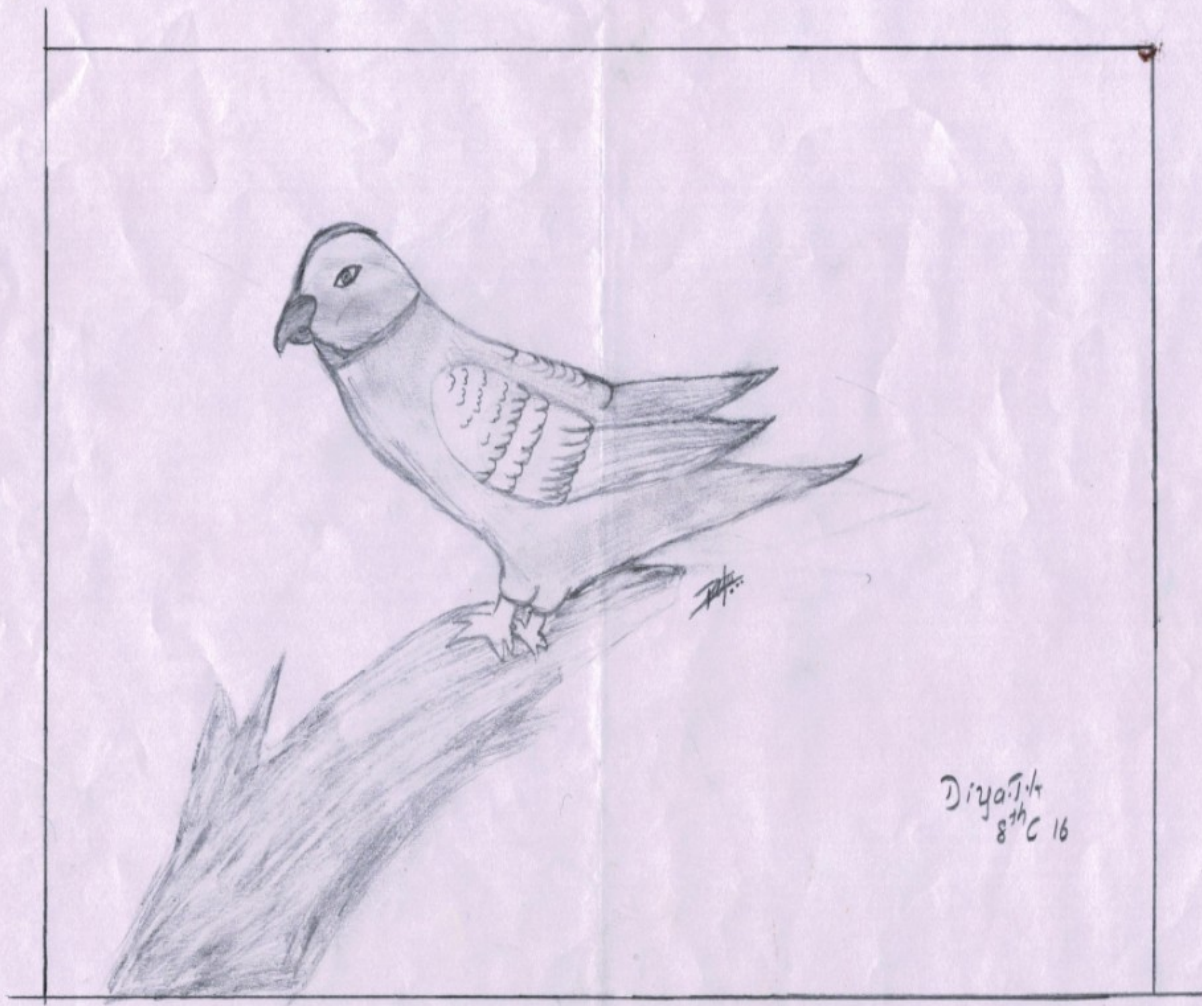
