


Essay writing English (H.S.S.)How far Gandhism influence the younger generation

The provoking injustice in this world prompts the younger generation to react vigorously. But reaction of Gandhiji against injustice was strictly based on the principle of non-violence. "He adopted the method of satyagraha to react against unscrupulous and ruling practices and governing of British".
 Gandhiji was fond of truth and peace. He read many religious texts including the Bible, Mahabharata, Bhagavat Gita, Quran, etc.,. He understood that all religions focused on the basic principles of truth. "From ^{the prevention} Disfranchising Bill to Quit India Movement", he used the strong tool of ahimsa, Satyagraha". Gandhiji never resorted to violence. He withdrew the 'Non-cooperation movement' due to the spreading of terror and violence. Gandhism conveys the younger generation to ~~be~~^{use the nonviolent tool of Satyagraha} instead of harsh reaction and revenge that cause catastrophic and disastrous series of events and huge loss in all manner.

In the Boer war and Zulu Rebellion, Gandhiji arranged Ambulance corps for comforting and helping the wounded. Even though it was for gaining the support of British, it teaches the young minds to be helpful and caring.



Younger generation are now losing their mental equilibrium due to drugs, ~~an~~ exposure to mobile phones, absurd usage of technology, usage of alcohol and tobacco products, violence around their surroundings etc.. In South Africa, Gandhiji adopted ashram for the Natal Indians and himself. As a result, he started Phoenix settlement and Tolstoy farm each and everyone in the Tolstoy farm and Phoenix settlement had to lead an upright and moral life, they were to be vegetarians and brahmacharis (those who were detached from worldly desires and 'kama' (pleasure)). The concept of ashram living is feasible and applicable to younger generation too.


